INTRODUCTION

This report corresponds to the inception workshop of the project "Water security: Improving access to water during emergency situations in the Province of San Antonio, Valparaíso Region", an activity that determines the start date of the Project.

In the following pages you can find in detail what was done in said Ceremony.





1. GENERAL BACKGROUND OF THE PROJECT.

To ensure the innovative and efficient consumption and management of water in the Municipality of Cartagena, the project "Water Security: Improving access to water during emergency situations in the Municipality of Cartagena, San Antonio province, Valparaíso Region" was launched.

The Project Objectives are:

- Ensure the existence of water distribution/accumulation points to deal with urban water scarcity.
- Promote Innovation and raise awareness in the local community about the efficient use of water.

The execution of this initiative considers a period of 18 months. During this term, the Chilean International Cooperation Agency for Development (AGCID) will work in partnership with the Regional Government of Valparaíso and the Municipality of Cartagena, thanks to the financing of the Climate Change Adaptation Fund (Adaptation Fund – World Bank).

The aforementioned term begins to govern from the date of the Inception Workshop, instance in which the Project is presented to the direct community and its relevant stakeholders.





2. INCEPTION WORKSHOP

2.1 Workshop date.

The Workshop was held on Wednesday, March 9, 2022 at the facilities of the Eugenia Subercaseaux High School, in the Municipality of Cartagena, starting the Project.

Its main objective was to present the project to the community, as well as its content and goal.

2.2 Workshop place.

The activity took place in the premises of the Eugenia Subercaseaux High School, an establishment where one of the three Project water supply points will be installed.

The Eugenia Subercaseaux High School is located in the urban area of the Municipality of Cartagena, Calle Fernando Calvo Nº 340, north of the town of San Sebastián. Currently its Director is Analía Cifuentes Uribe.

"This establishment has three fundamental pillars that are Inclusion, Citizen Training with a focus on caring for the Environment and Self-care and Sports through healthy coexistence and proper care". It teaches "from Pre-Elementary education to High School and Technical High School, with the Specialty of Refrigeration and Air Conditioning, thus becoming an important pillar in the training of children and young people of the Town and the Municipality".

2.4 Development

During the activity, the authorities presented the project and the importance it will have for the community.

The Executive Director of AGCID, Mr. Cristián Jara, addressed the attendees explaining that due to the internationalization of Chile, it is possible to access to this type of resources, thanking the contribution made by the Climate Change Adaptation Fund in supporting and financing this type of innovative initiatives, those that work from the local space. In this scenario, he reflected: "What do we get out of water being a recognized human right, if we don't have water or a water infrastructure, if there is no awareness, if there is no adequate governance? The school community, in these Public Policies designed from the bases, has a special value".

Likewise, the Mayor of the Municipality of Cartagena, Mr. Rodrigo García, thanked the Authorities and Institutions involved, commenting that, as a Municipality, they are very happy to be part of this initiative of an unprecedented Project in the country, and that they are grateful that Cartagena be the chosen location for its installation.





Likewise, the authority valued the important role of educational institutions, emphasizing that: "Teachers play a fundamental role, and instill in our children, day by day, the purpose we have of caring for water. Also note that it is not by chance that in Cartagena there is the first sustainable school in Chile and the second in South America".

In turn, the Regional Administrator of the Regional Government of Valparaíso, Macarena Pereira, stated: "We want to give support to this initiative, which although it is a Pilot Project, is an experience that we can work together with this community and that we can project to the region. From here a great example can come out at the regional level because the water situation is a situation that crosses the entire Region and the country". This initiative is in line with the challenges defined in the "Regional Water Development and Sustainability Policy" (2019), which addresses in a more limited way the problem of water scarcity that affects the Valparaíso Region, for which specific actions and goals related to three pillars are proposed: Security and increase in the supply of water; sustainability of water demand; and water governance and management.

The activity ended with the presentation of the Project to the attendees by the Regional Government.

In the first place, the **Head of the Planning and Development Division, Mrs. Débora Vega**, addressed the attendees who, in her opening speech, explained the main objective of the project "It is a pilot project that will be located in schools, being part of its equipment, and will attend to emergency cases, especially in prolonged outages that may be suffered from the water crisis that we have in the Region", he also referred to the support of AGCID in its work with the Regions, and its importance: "The work carried out by AGCID in the regions is decentralized cooperation, being a success, a strategic view of being able to generate collaboration networks, from the regions with local communities. The link between the Agency, the regional governments, and local governments, is a fundamental strategic triad to develop this type of initiatives and others that can be implemented".

Next, the **Professional in charge of the Project, Mr. Esteban Ortiz**, presented the Project through schematic sheets that allowed the attendees to better understand the Project. In them, he explained: "The project stems from a great initiative between AGCID and GORE, financed by the Adaptation Fund, and whose objective is to build a structure that helps improve water support conditions in cases of emergency in the community and works as an interactive source of information for it".

The participants also learned about the places where the pilot projects will be installed: "The project will be installed in three schools in the Municipality, located north, center and south of Cartagena, covering a radius of reach of almost the entire Municipality. All





locations are public places, easily accessible and with infrastructure suitable for their installation and with a student community of children and young people, which will make it possible to raise awareness among the younger population about more sustainable habits.

The timeline of the Project was also presented, from its formulation to its execution, explaining to the attendees: "The duration of the project will take place over 18 months (March 2022 - September 2023) divided into two work phases: "Design and preparation" in which the different products that will be executed in the workshops and the design of the pilot to be built are elaborated, which will be obtained through a public contest open to the community. A second phase in which the execution of both the workshops and the construction of the pilot projects will be carried out". The project will be developed and elaborated for and with the community, thus allowing the development of this great pilot project that will allow not only to deliver water to the community in an efficient and innovative way, but also to transmit awareness of water care to the community of Cartagena and possibly replicable at the national level".







With the aim of improving access to drinking water in emergency situations in vulnerable areas of the Municipality of Cartagena, the implementation of the Water Security pilot project was carried out, which seeks to guarantee consumption through innovative management financed by the Fund Adaptation to Climate Change.

Given the serious water situation that our country is experiencing, this pilot project considers a design that will allow the Municipality of Cartagena to maintain access to drinking water for the population during, for example, prolonged supply cuts. It also contemplates dissemination actions on the use and management of water in situations of scarcity such as the one currently maintained by the region.

The Executive Director of AGCID. Cristián Jara said that thanks to the internationalization of Chile it is possible to access this type of resources. Jara pointed out "what do we get out of water being a recognized human right if we don't have water, if there is no water infrastructure, if there is no condensing, if there is not adequate governance, and in that the school community, in these public policies designed from the bases, has a special value".



In Chile, during the last decade, there has been a pronounced decrease in rainfall, especially in the North and Central zones, deepening the situation of water scarcity in various parts of its territory, which has endangered the supply of water to the population and damaged productive activity. As a result, in 2019 the Government of Chile declared the Valparaíso Region a "Drought Catastrophe Zone", this being one of the driest seasons in the last 50 years.

It is in this context that on March 9 of this year, the ceremony called "Inception Workshop" was held in the community of Cartagena, which begins a Pilot Project on Water Safety: "Improvement of access to water during emergency situations", which is part of the "National Policy for Adaptation to Climate Change" and the "United Nations International Framework Convention on Climate Change".

This project was submitted to the Adaptation Fund Board ¹⁶ or held on October 10 and 11, 2019 in Bonn, Germany, by the International Cooperation Agency for Development (AGCID) ¹⁹ in collaboration with the Regional Government of Valparaíso, being approved for its execution through the "Small Scale Innovation Subsidy Agreement" ²⁰ This is how the Regional Government of Valparaíso intends, through this Project, to contribute to the improvement of the access to water in emergency situations and/or disasters by obtaining better solutions that provide a good service to






